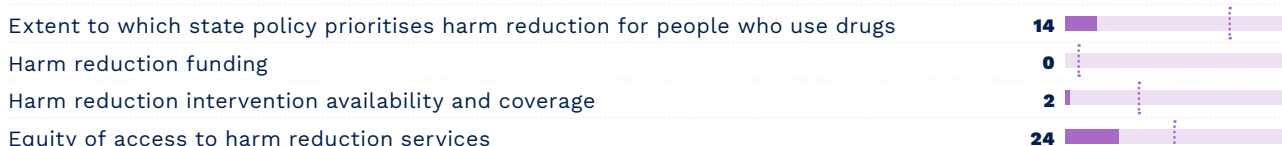
ABSENCE OF EXTREME SENTENCING AND RESPONSES



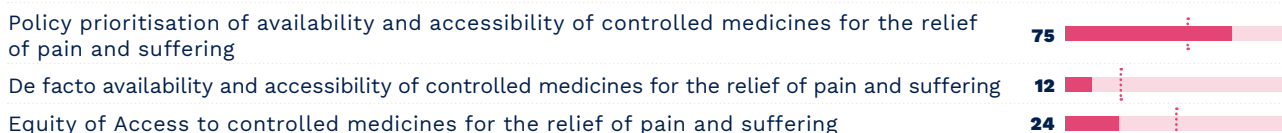
PROPORTIONALITY OF THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESPONSE
